Signed in the English and Persian Languages at Tehran, January 7, 1892.

IT is hereby agreed between the Undersigned, duly authorised thereto by their respective Governments, that the Convention signed at Tehran on the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, for extending and securing telegraphic communication between Europe and India, shall remain in force until the thirty-first of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

Done at Tehran, this seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, being equivalent to the sixth day of Jemadi as-Sani, one thousand three hundred and nine.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BRITISH AND PERSIAN GOVERNMENTS TO PROLONG, UNTIL JANUARY 31, 1925, THE CONVENTION OF DECEMBER 2, 1872, RESPECTING TELEGRAPHIC COMMUNICATION BETWEEN EUROPE AND INDIA THROUGH PERSIA.

Signed in the English and Persian Languages at Tehran, January 7, 1892.

IT is hereby agreed between the Undersigned, duly authorised thereto by their respective Governments, that the Convention signed at Tehran on the second of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, for continuing the system of telegraphic communication between Europe and India through Persia, shall remain in force until the thirty-first of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

Done at Tehran, this seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, being equivalent to the sixth day of Jemadi as-Sani, one thousand three hundred and nine.
