Your Excellency, Cairo, February 14, 1931.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of the note of the 13th November last in which your Excellency called attention to the fact that the Provisional Commercial Agreement(1) concluded between the Egyptian Government and the Government of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland by the notes dated the 5th June and the 7th June, 1930, would expire on the 16th February next and suggested its prolongation until the 16th February, 1932,

under the same conditions as those now obtaining.

Having brought your Excellency's proposal to the knowledge of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, I am now authorised to inform you that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland will be glad to agree to the suggested prolongation of the said Provisional Commercial Agreement, and I have accordingly the honour to state that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are prepared to regard the present note and a note from your Excellency confirming acceptance by the Egyptian Government of an agreement to this effect as constituting an agreement between the two Governments which shall come into force immediately on the receipt of your Excellency's note and shall remain in force until the 16th February, 1932, unless previously replaced by a treaty regulating definitely the commercial relations between the United Kingdom and Egypt.
