Sir P. Loraine to Abdul Fattah Yehia Pasha,

The Residency,

Your Excellency, Cairo, February 14, 1931.

I have the honour, with reference to the note of the 13th November last, in which your Excellency called attention to the fact that the provisional commercial agreement(1) concluded between the Egyptian Government and the Government of the Irish Free State by the notes dated the 25th July and the 28th July, 1930, would expire on the 16th February next and suggested its prolongation until the 16th February, 1932, under the same conditions as those now obtaining, to inform you, at the instance of His Majesty's Government in the Irish Free State and under instructions from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that His Majesty's Government in the Irish Free State will be glad to agree to the suggested prolongation of the provisional reciprocal most-favoured-nation agreement in question.

I have accordingly the honour to state that His Majesty's Government in the Irish Free State is prepared to regard the present note and a note from your Excellency confirming acceptance by the Egyptian Government of an agreement to this effect as constituting an agreement between the two Governments which shall come into force immediately on the receipt of your Excellency's note and shall remain in force until the 16th February, 1932, unless previously replaced by treaty regulating definitely the commercial relations

between the Irish Free State and Egypt.
