Mr. Forbes to Mr. Fay.

Wellington, October 20, 1933.

I HAVE the honour to inform you that, pending the conclusion of a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Norway and New Zealand, the New Zealand Government will accord to Norway the same treatment in matters of commerce, customs and navigation as is or may be accorded to the most favoured foreign country, provided that the Norwegian Government grant to New Zealand the same treatment in matters of commerce, customs and navigation.

It is understood that the term "foreign country" in relation to New Zealand means a country not being part of the British Commonwealth of Nations nor a territory under British protection or suzerainty nor a mandated territory in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of a part of the British Commonwealth of Nations.

It is further understood that the aforesaid treatment shall continue in force until the expiration of three months from the date on which either Government shall have given to the other notice of revocation of the arrangement.

Mr. Fay to Mr. Forbes.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your note, dated the 20th instant, on the subject of the treatment to be accorded by the New Zealand Government to Norway in matters of commerce, customs and navigation, pending the conclusion of a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Norway and New Zealand.

Under instructions from my Government, I beg to inform you that the Norwegian Government will on their side accord to New

Zealand the same treatment in matters of commerce, customs and navigation as is or may be accorded to the most favoured foreign country, provided that the New Zealand Government grant to Norway the same treatment in matters of commerce, customs and navigation.

It is understood that the term "foreign country" in relation to New Zealand means a country not being part of the British Commonwealth of Nations nor a territory under British protection or suzerainty nor a mandated territory in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of a part of the British Commonwealth of Nations.

It is further understood that the aforesaid treatment shall continue in force until the expiration of three months from the date on which either Government shall have given to the other notice of revocation of the arrangement.
