The Prime Minister of New Zealand to the Consul of Belgium in New Zealand.

REFERRING to the Commercial Arrangement concluded on the 5th December, 1933,(1) between the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg and New Zealand, I have the honour to inform you that that Arrangement has now, by mutual agreement, been modified as follows:—

His Majesty's Government in New Zealand will admit for importation goods being the produce or manufacture of the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg and enumerated in Schedule "A" attached to this letter at duties not higher than those indicated in that Schedule, provided that the Government of the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg will admit for importation goods being the produce or manufacture of New Zealand, enumerated in Schedule "B" attached to this letter, at duties not higher than those set out in that Schedule.

It is understood that the present modification constitutes in all respects an integral part of the Commercial Arrangement of the 5th December, 1933, referred to above, and will continue in force accordingly until the expiration of six months from the date on which either Government shall have given to the other notice of revocation of the Arrangement.

It is understood that the present modification constitutes in all respects an integral part of the Commercial Arrangement of the 5th December, 1933, referred to above, and will continue in force accordingly until the expiration of six months from the date on which either Government shall have given to the other notice of revocation of the Arrangement.
