Exchange of Notes between His Majesty's Government IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE GOVERNMENT OF FINLAND REGARDING THE IMPORTATION OF WHEATEN FLOUR INTO FINLAND.

London, April 14, 1937.

I HAVE the honour to inform you that the Government of Finland, having regard to the discussions which have taken place on the subject of the importations of United Kingdom wheat flour into Finland, submit the following proposals:-

(a) The duties and charges imposed on importations into Finland of wheat flour (tariff No. 44), produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom, shall not be other or higher than those specified below:—

Rate of Duty.

(1) On importations up to an annual total of 19,850 metric tons (being equivalent to the average of the quantities imported from the United Kingdom during the years 1935 and 1936).

(2) On importations in excess of an annual total of 19,850 metric tons.

The rate in force from time to time as the general duty on wheat in grain increased by 0.60 Finnish mark per kilogram.

The rate in force from time to time as the general duty on wheat in grain increased by 1.00 Finnish mark per kilogram.

(b) For the future, paragraph 2 (a) shall be regarded as deleted from Part I of the Protocol to the Commercial Agreement between Finland and the United Kingdom signed at Helsinki on the 29th September, 1983.(1)

If the Government of the United Kingdom agree to the proposal set out above, I would suggest that the present Note and your reply thereto should be regarded as constituting a formal agreement between the two Governments, which shall come into force on the 10th May, 1937, and shall remain in force so long as the Commercial Agreement of 1933 is in operation.
