Luang Pradist Manudharm to Sir J. Crosby.

Ministry for Foreign Affairs,

M. le Ministre, Bangkok, November 13, 1987.

I have the honour to inform your Excellency that the Siamese Government undertake, subject to reciprocity, and subject to the approval of the Assembly, that the rights hitherto enjoyed in Siam under the Anglo-Siamese treaties of 1925(1) by British subjects and protected persons and by British vessels, companies and goods shall be continued until the coming into force of the new treaty, (2) but for not more than four months from the 4th November, 1937.

Sir J. Crosby to Luang Pradist Manudharm.

British Legation,

M. le Ministre,

Bangkok, November 13, 1937.

I have the honour, upon instructions from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to inform your Excellency that the Government of the United Kingdom undertake, subject to reciprocity, that the rights hitherto enjoyed in the United Kingdom, in the Straits Settlements and in the Malay States under British protection under the Anglo-Siamese treaties of 1925 by Siamese subjects, vessels, companies and goods shall be continued until the coming into force of the new treaty, but for not more than four months from the 4th November, 1937.
