14th April, 1948.

I have the honour to propose that the Monetary Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Portuguese Government signed in London on 16th April, 1946,(1) and which according to Article 11 will terminate on 15th April, 1948, unless the Contracting Governments agreed otherwise, shall be continued for a period of one year from the latter date.

If the Portuguese Government agree to this proposal, I have the honour to suggest that the present note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.
