HAVING been informed by His Majesty's Foreign Office of their readiness to accept my proposal regarding a further prolongation of the Monetary Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Czechoslovak Republic, signed in London on the 1st November, 1945(1), I have the honour to propose that this Agreement be further prolonged for a period of two months after the 4th January, 1949, provided that the provisions of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (i) of Article 2 of the said Agreement shall not apply during the proposed extended period.

If His Majesty's Government agree to this proposal I have the honour to suggest that the present note and your reply to that effect shall be regarded

as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the Czechoslovak Ambassador

Your Excellency, Foreign Office, 3rd January, 1949. In reply to your Note of the 31st December, 1948, regarding a further prolongation of the Monetary Agreement between the Government of the Czechoslovak Republic and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland signed in London on the 1st November, 1945, which, as prolonged by Notes exchanged between this Department and the Czechoslovak Chargé d'Affaires on the 4th November, 1948(2), will terminate on the 4th January, 1949, unless the Contracting Governments otherwise agree, I have the honour to inform you that the Government of the United Kingdom accept your proposal that the Agreement be further prolonged for a period of two months after the 4th January, 1949, provided that the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (i) of Article 2 of the said Agreement shall not apply during the proposed extended period.

2. The Government of the United Kingdom will regard your Note and

the present reply as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.
