I have the honour to propose that, in pursuance of arrangements discussed by Representatives of the two Governments in London, the Monetary Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Czechoslovak Republic, signed in London on the 1st November, 1945(1), and which in accordance with the exchange of notes dated 27th and 30th April (2) between you and this Department will terminate on the 4th July, 1949, unless the Contracting Governments agree otherwise, shall be further prolonged for a period of one month after the latter date, provided, however, that the provisions of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (i) of Article 2 of the said Agreement shall not
