His Majesty's Ambassador at The Hague to the Netherlands Minister of Foreign Affairs

British Embassy,

The Hague, 7th July, 1949. Sir. I HAVE the honour to put on record the understanding reached between our two Governments in connection with long-term contracts (i.e., contracts for a period of 3 years or more) in respect of United Kingdom purchases from

the Netherlands.

It is not possible at this stage to foresee the effect on the balance of payments, between the sterling area on the one hand and the Netherlands and the Belgium-Luxembourg Union on the other hand, of the arrangements at present contemplated for the formation of an economic union between

the Netherlands and the Belgium-Luxembourg Union.

3. In these circumstances, it is understood between the Royal Netherlands Government and His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom that if, following arrangements for the formation of an economic union between the Netherlands and the Belgium-Luxembourg Union, His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are involved in a liability to make settlements in goldor hard currency, other than a liability emanating from an eventual Western European payment arrangement, the Royal Netherlands Government and His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom shall consult together and use their best endeavours to avoid the liability for such settlements; and, failing other agreed measures for this purpose, His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom shall have the right to reduce their purchases under long-term contracts as may be necessary.
