Sir,

London, 30th April, 1952.

With reference to the Notes exchanged on 31st October, 1951⁽¹⁾, between the Norwegian Ambassador and yourself, extending for a further period of six months the Agreement of 5th June, 1947⁽²⁾, between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Royal Norwegian Government relating to the participation of a Norwegian Brigade Group in the occupation of Germany, I have the honour to propose that the Agreement shall be further extended, subject as mentioned below, for a period not to exceed one year to expire on 1st May, 1953, unless further prolonged by agreement between the contracting Governments.

It is understood that, in accordance with the provisions of the Exchange of Notes referred to above, the present Agreement shall only apply in so far as it does not conflict with such military agreements as have been or shall be made from time to time between the authorities concerned.

If the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland accept these proposals, I have the honour to propose that this Note together with your reply to this effect shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments.
