The Danish Ambassador at London to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs

Sir,

London, 13th March, 1953.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the Kingdom of Denmark and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland for Air Services between and beyond their respective territories, signed at London on the 23rd June, 1952,⁽¹⁾ and to propose that Route (5) of Schedule II to the Annex to that Agreement should be amended to read as follows:—

In the Danish text—

(5) Pladser i Danmark—Hamburg eller Amsterdam—Frankfurt—Zürich—Rom—Athen—Lydda eller Cairo—Khartoum—Nairobi—Durban eller Johannesburg.

In the English text—

(5) Points in Denmark—Hamburg or Amsterdam—Frankfurt—Zurich—Rome—Athens—Lydda or Cairo—Khartoum—Nairobi—Durban or Johannesburg.

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and your Excellency's reply in that sense should be regarded as constituting an agreement between our two Governments, which shall take effect immediately.
