I have the honor to refer to the Exchange of Notes of June 5, 1956,<sup>(1)</sup> between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland bringing into force the Memorandum of Understanding relating to the Sale of Tobacco by the United States Government and the Construction of Housing and/or Community Facilities by the Government of the United Kingdom. I am now authorized to propose that the amount agreed in paragraph 1 of the Memorandum of Understanding attached to the Note of June 5 be increased to \$18 million of tobacco.

If this proposal meets with the approval of the Government of the United Kingdom, I would suggest that this Note and your affirmative reply should be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments, which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.
