**EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE
UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN
IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF ISRAEL AMENDING
THE AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT OF DECEMBER 6, 1950**

I have the honour to refer to the discussions which took place in July and August 1959 between representatives of the aeronautical authorities of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the State of Israel regarding the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Israel for Air Services between and beyond their respective territories, signed at London on the 6th of December, 1950,⁽¹⁾ and the Exchange of Notes of the same date⁽¹⁾ made with reference thereto. During these discussions it was agreed in principle that:

- (a) Section I of the Schedule to the said Agreement should be amended to include Athens in the intermediate points on Routes 1 and 2;
- (b) the provisions of Notes Numbers 3 and 4 of the Exchanges of Notes should be regarded as being no longer applicable and that the services provided by the Israel airlines designated to operate on Route 3 in Section II of the Schedule to the Agreement should not exceed three per week in each direction.

I now have the honour to propose, on behalf of Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, that if the above provisions are acceptable to the Government of Israel, this Note together with Your Excellency's reply in that sense should be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the two Governments on these matters, which shall take effect on the date of your reply.
