**EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF DENMARK EXTENDING THE AGREEMENT OF MAY 10, 1961, TO BRITISH VISITOR'S PASSPORTS ISSUED IN THE CHANNEL ISLANDS AND THE ISLE OF MAN**

*Her Majesty's Ambassador at Copenhagen to the Danish Minister for Foreign Affairs*

*British Embassy,*

Your Excellency,

*Copenhagen, July 27, 1961.*

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement constituted by the Exchange of Notes of the 10th of May, 1961, between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Denmark concerning the acceptance of British Visitor's Passports for travel between the United Kingdom and Denmark<sup>(1)</sup>.

2. I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that British Visitor's Passports are now available for issue in the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to British subjects, citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies. These British Visitor's Passports are valid for one year from the date of issue. An applicant for a British Visitor's Passport is not required by the authorities of the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man to produce documentary evidence of his identity and national status, but he is required to sign a declaration that he is a British subject, citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies. Specimens of the British Visitor's Passports issued by the authorities of Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man are attached as Annexes A, B and C to the present Note<sup>(2)</sup>.

3. I therefore have the honour to propose, on the instructions of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that reference to "British Visitor's Passport" in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 3 of my Note No. 46 of the 10th of May, 1961 shall be deemed to include the British Visitor's Passports issued by the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man authorities, and the words "their territory" in the second line of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 3 of that Note shall be understood to mean the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

4. If the above proposals are acceptable to the Government of Denmark, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and Your Excellency's reply to that effect should place on record the agreement of the two Governments in this matter.
