## BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TRELAND-AMENDING THE AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT OF 5 APRIL 1946

Her Majesty's Ambassador at Dublin to the Minister for External Affairs of the Republic of Ireland

British Embassy,

Your Excellency.

Dublin, 24 July, 1967.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between our two Governments relating to Air Services signed at London on 5th April, 1946,(1) and subsequent Exchanges of Letters of 1947, 1948, 1951, 1952,(2) 1956,(3) 1958,(4) 1959,(5) 1960,(6) 1961,(7) 1964,(8) 1965,(9) 1966(10) and April 1967,(11) modifying the Agreement, and to discussions which have taken place between the aeronautical authorities of our respective Governments regarding the further modification of Schedule IV of the Annex to the Agreement.

In pursuance of those discussions and of Article 8 of the Air Services Agreement the United Kingdom Government propose that the following route shall be added to Schedule IV-

Schedule IV

Manchester-Cork ".

The United Kingdom Government also propose that the following modification shall be made to Schedule IV-

Schedule IV

For route 17 there shall be substituted—

"17. Derby and/or Birmingham-Cork".

If your Government agree to the above proposals I suggest that this letter and your reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our two Governments.

Please accept. Your Excellency, the renewed assurance of my highest consideration.
