Your Excellency,

17 February, 1970.

I have the honour to refer to the Exchange of Notes which took place between the Government of the Republic of Indonesia and the Government of the United Kingdom on 22nd October, 1969, which it was agreed should be referred to as the United Kingdom/Indonesia No. 5 Loan (1969)⁽¹⁾—Provision of Goods and Services from the United Kingdom, and the further discussions that have recently taken place between our two Governments concerning that Loan, and to propose that the United Kingdom/Indonesia No. 5 Loan (1969)—Provision of Goods and Services from the United Kingdom should be amended in the following respects:

- a. In the first paragraph Part A the figures "£500,000" and the words "Five hundred thousand pounds sterling" shall be deleted and replaced by "£566,000" and "Five hundred and sixty six thousand pounds sterling".
- b. In the first paragraph Part B (3) (a) (iii), the date "31st December 1969" shall be deleted and replaced by "28th February 1970".
- c. In the first paragraph Part B (8) the figures "£13,900", "£13,900" and "£13,500" shall be deleted and replaced by "£16,000", "£16,000" and "£6,000".

In view of these amendments, the Government of the Republic of Indonesia through the Central Bank of Indonesia (Bank Indonesia) shall by a letter in the form set out at Appendix A to this Note amend the request addressed to the Manager of the Lloyds Bank Limited on 13th November, 1969, to open an account in the name of the Bank Indonesia to be styled United Kingdom/Indonesia Number 5 (BE) Loan (1969) account.

If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Indonesia, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note together with your reply in that sense shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments to amend the United Kingdom/Indonesia No. 5 Loan (1969)—Provision of Goods and Services from the United Kingdom which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurances of my highest consideration.
