Dear Minister.

I have the honour to refer to the discussions between official delegations which took place in London on 16 and 17 February 1972 concerning the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Malawi for Air Services between and beyond their respective territories signed at Blantyre on 27 September 1968.(1)

I now have the honour to propose, in accordance with the decisions reached in the discussions, that the Schedule annexed to the Agreement be amended as follows:

Part I

Amend the first word to read "Routes".

Insert "1." immediately before "London-Points in Europe-Points in Africa-Blantyre-Points beyond."

Add "2. Seychelles-Blantyre."

Part II

Amend the first word to read "Routes".

Insert "1." immediately before "Blantyre-Intermediate points to be agreed-London."

Add "2. Malawi-Mahe, Seychelles."

If the above proposals are acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Malawi I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply to that effect should be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our two Governments in this matter which shall enter into force on today's date.

I avail myself of this opportunity to convey to you the expression of my highest consideration.
