EXCHANGE OF NOTES

BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA CONCERNING THE TRANSFER OF CERTAIN AREAS OF ELEUTHERA FROM THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE TO THE UNITED STATES NAVY UNDER THE TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF OCEANOGRAPHIC RESEARCH STATIONS IN THE BAHAMA ISLANDS OF 1 NOVEMBER 1957

The Consul General of the United States of America at Nassau to the Acting Governor of the Bahamas

Excellency, Nassau, August 9, 1971.

I have the honor to advise you that as a result of changes in operational requirements and arrangements between the United States Air Force and Navy, the Air Force Auxiliary Airfield, Eleuthera, is being disestablished as an Air Force activity.

It is now proposed to transfer certain areas which were previously controlled by the U.S. Air Force and held by the United States Government under the Long Range Proving Ground Agreement signed July 21, 1950,(1) to the U.S. Navy as part of the U.S. Naval Facility, Eleuthera, under the terms of the Agreement for the Establishment of Oceanographic Research Stations in the Bahama Islands, signed November 1, 1957.(2) The tracts involved are listed and described in Attachment 1(3) (Metes and Bounds) and are shown in Attachment 2(4) (Real Estate Maps).

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, I have the honor to propose that the present Note and attachments thereto, together with Your Excellency's reply in that sense, shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of Your Excellency's reply.

Accept, Excellency, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
