Dear Prime Minister,

10 November 1972.

I have the honour to refer to discussions which have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Mauritius relating to the modification of certain provisions of the British Expatriates Supplementation (Mauritius) Agreement of 1971⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the 1971 Agreement") and to place on record the terms of the amendments to the 1971 Agreement which were resolved:

"1. There shall be added to the first annex of the 1971 Agreement the following organisations:

'Development Works Corporation Central Water Authority'."

If this letter correctly sets out the amendments that have been agreed I have the honour to suggest that this letter and your reply should be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Mauritius and that this Agreement should be read together with the 1971 Agreement.
