Your Excellency,

26 July, 1975.

I have the honour to refer to the agreement signed on the 3rd of June 1975 between the Kuwait Ministry of Electricity and Water and the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority, acting through its Atomic Energy Research Establishment at Harwell, regarding consultancy services and training facilities.

In view of the United Kingdom's obligations under the Treaty on the Non-proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, signed at London, Moscow and Washington on 1 July 1968(1), the Government of the United Kingdom wish to seek the assurance of the Government of Kuwait that any information and technology made available to Kuwait by or from the United Kingdom under the consultancy and training agreement referred to above and any nuclear material, equipment and facilities supplied to Kuwait by or from the United Kingdom in connection with the implementation of the agreement shall be used for peaceful purposes only and shall not be used for the development, manufacture or detonation of any nuclear explosive device, or for research in the development, manufacture or detonation of such nuclear explosive device.

I have the honour to propose that this Note and Your Excellency's reply giving the foregoing assurance on behalf of the Government of Kuwait shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments, which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

Please accept, Your Excellency, the assurance of my highest consideration.
