## Your Excellency

- 1. I have the honour to refer to the Agreement on the Status of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, National Representatives and International Staff signed at Ottawa on 20 September 1951(1) and in particular to Article 10 of the Agreement in view of alterations in the tax system of the United Kingdom.
- 2. I now have the honour to propose that Article 10 should be interpreted and applied in the United Kingdom so as to accord the Organization a refund of car tax and value added tax on the purchase of new motor cars of United Kingdom manufacture, and of value added tax paid on the supply of goods or services necessary for its official activities and which are supplied on a recurring basis or involve considerable quantities of goods or considerable expenditure.
- 3. If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization I have the honour to propose that this Note, together with Your Excellency's reply in that sense, shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Organization which shall enter into force on the date on which the United Kingdom legislation giving effect to the Agreement comes into operation, which date will be notified to the Organization.(2)
