The United Kingdom High Commissioner at Port Louis to the Prime Minister of Mauritius

Sir,

1976.

I have the honour to refer to the discussions which have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Mauritius in accordance with the conclusions reached in the discussions between Your Excellency and the British Secretary of State for Defence on 25 April 1975 and recorded in the Communiqué of 26 April 1975 that HMS Mauritius should be closed at the end of March 1976 and that action should be taken to terminate at that time the Agreement on Mutual Defence and Assistance. On behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom I accordingly have the honour to propose that the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Mauritius on Mutual Defence and Assistance signed at Port Louis on 12 March 1968(1) shall terminate with effect from 31 March

2. If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of Mauritius, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and Your Excellency's reply in that sense shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter which shall enter into force on today's date.

Accept, Sir, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
