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EXCHANGE OF NOTES

BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF GHANA AMENDING AND EXTENDING THE BRITISH EXPATRIATES SUPPLEMENTATION (GHANA) AGREEMENT 1971

- 1. I have the honour to refer to discussions that have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Ghana concerning the continuance of the British Expatriates Supplementation (Ghana) Agreement 1971(1) (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") and certain matters related to passage costs thereunder and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:
 - 1. In sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures "31 March 1976" and substitute the words and figures "31 March 1981".
 - 2. In paragraph 1 of the Second Annex after the words "annex to" add the words "or in respect of".
 - 3. Following paragraph 2 of the Second Annex add a new paragraph 3A as follows:
 - "3A. The Government of the United Kingdom will meet the cost of providing for designated officers and their dependant families passages on such occasions (not being occasions referred to in paragraph 3B of this annex) as the Government of Ghana may, with the prior concurrence of the Government of the United Kingdom, prescribe. Passages for designated officers and their dependant families should be by British carrier and, where practicable, by excursion or charter flight".
 - 4. Re-number paragraph "3" of the Second Annex as "3B".
- 2. If this Note correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain

and Northern Ireland and the Government of Ghana which shall enter into force on 31 March 1976 and which shall be cited together with the Agreement as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Ghana) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76.
