I have the honour to refer to discussions which have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Uganda relating to certain members of the staff of Makerere University under the provisions of the British Expatriates Supplementation Scheme (Uganda) Agreement 1971⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") which is due to terminate on 31 March 1976 and to place on record the terms that have been agreed:

- (1) The Government of the United Kingdom will be prepared to continue the benefits under the Agreement as amended by sub-paragraph 2 of this paragraph after 31 March 1976 in respect of those officers specified by the Government of the United Kingdom in the Annex to the Agreement.
- (2) The amendments to the Agreement referred to in sub-paragraph 1 of this paragraph are as follows:—
 - (a) In the line 5 of sub-paragraph 1 after the words "United Kingdom" add the words "specified in the Annex to this Agreement".
 - (b) Following sub-paragraph 2 of paragraph 1 add a new sub-paragraph 2A to read: "2A. The Government of the United Kingdom will reimburse Makerere University the amount paid by it in providing for designated officers and their dependent families passages on such occasions (not being occasions referred to in sub-paragraph 2 (c) of paragraph 1 of this Agreement) as the Government of the Republic of Uganda may, with the prior concurrence of the Government of the United Kingdom, prescribe. Passages for designated officers and their dependent families should be, where available, by British carrier and where practicable by excursion or charter flight".
 - (c) In sub-paragraph 9 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures "31st day of March 1976" and substitute therefor the words and figures "31 March 1978".

(d) Add an Annex to the Agreement containing the names of the following officers:—

Professor W. Brodie
Professor B. W. Langlands
Mrs. M. S. M. MacPherson

If this Note correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Uganda which shall enter into force on 31 March 1976 and which shall be cited together with the Agreement as the British Expatriates Supplementation Scheme (Uganda) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/1976.
