**Sir,**

1. I have the honour to refer to discussions which have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Malawi concerning the continuance of the British Expatriates Supplementation (Malawi) Agreement 1971<sup>(1)</sup> hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement" and certain matters relating to the passage costs thereunder and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:

1. In sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures "31 March 1976" and substitute therefor the words and figures "31 March 1979".
2. In paragraph 1 of the First Annex after the word "payments" add the words "and reimbursements" and after the words "annex to" add the words "or in respect of".
3. Following paragraph 3 of the First Annex add a new paragraph 3A as follows:

"3A. The Government of the United Kingdom will reimburse the employing authority the amount paid by the employing authority in providing for designated officers and their dependent families passages on such occasions (not being occasions referred to in paragraph 3 of this Annex) as the Government of Malawi, with the prior concurrence of the Government of the United Kingdom, prescribe. Passages for designated officers and their dependent families should be, where available, by British carrier and, where practicable, by excursion or charter flight."

4. At the end of paragraph 7 of the First Annex after the words "United Kingdom." add the following sentence "In particular, if a designated officer's appointment is prematurely terminated, or if he should be suspended from duty with loss of pay, the Government of Malawi will forthwith inform the Government of the United Kingdom through its accredited representative in Malawi and in the case of termination give details of the financial and leave benefits due to the designated officer concerned."

5. In the Second Annex after " University of Malawi " add :

Malawi Polytechnic  
Zomba Boys Catholic Secondary School  
Montfort Teacher Training College  
St Patricks Secondary School  
Mtendere Secondary School  
Likuni Boys Secondary School  
Malosa Secondary School  
Providence Secondary School

2. If this Note correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Malawi which shall be deemed to have entered into force on 31 March 1976 and which shall be cited, together with the Agreement, as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Malawi) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76.
