At the first meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention, held in Berne 2–6 November, 1976, certain amendments to Appendices I and II were adopted. As a consequence of these amendments Appendix III was revised. In accordance with the provisions of Article XV (1) (c) of the Convention the amendments to Appendices I and II entered into force on 4 February, 1977 and the revised Appendix III entered into force on the same date.  In a Note dated 3 February, 1977 and received by the Swiss authorities the same day, the Government of the United Kingdom, in accordance with the provisions of Article XV (3) of the Convention, made a reservation in respect of Hong Kong for the African elephant, Loxodonta Africana, which was added to Appendix II at the first meeting of the Berne Conference. Availing itself of this occasion of the deposit of its instruments of ratification, Switzerland makes the

following declaration:
