Your Excellency

I have the honour to refer to the British Expatriates Supplementation (Lesotho) Agreement 1976 (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement"), as renewed and amended by the British Expatriates Supplementation (Lesotho) Agreement 1976/81 and by the British Expatriates Supplementation (Lesotho) Agreement 1976/81, Amendment 1981, and to propose that the Agreement be amended:

- (a) by deleting in sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph 1 the words and figures "31 March 1986" and substituting therefor the words and figures "31 March 1991"; and
- (b) at the end of paragraph 3 of the First Annex add a further sentence to read as follows: "The Government of the United Kingdom shall, after consultation with and on behalf of the Government of Lesotho, reimburse the outward passage costs directly to an agent of the Government of Lesotho within the United Kingdom."

If these proposals are acceptable to the Government of Lesotho, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and Your Excellency's reply shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments, which shall be deemed to have entered into force on 31 March 1986 and which shall be cited as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Lesotho) Agreement 1976/86.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurances of my highest consideration.
