I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Hungary concerning the Establishment of the International Peto Institute in Budapest, hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement", done at Budapest on 12 February 1991<sup>1</sup>.

I now have the honour to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:

In Article 2 for "one million two hundred and fifty thousand pounds sterling (£1,250,000)" there should be substituted "one million seven hundred and fifty thousand pounds sterling (£1,750,000)"; and

In Article 3 for "three million seven hundred and fifty thousand pounds sterling (£3,750,000)" there shall be substituted "three million two hundred and fifty thousand pounds sterling (£3,250,000)".

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Hungary, I have the honour to propose that this Note, and Your Excellency's reply to that effect, shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of Your Excellency's reply. To that end, I enclose a form of reply which Your Excellency may find helpful.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Hungary the assurance of my highest consideration.
