**AMENDMENT
TO ARTICLE 16, PARAGRAPH 1 OF THE STATUTE OF THE
INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR THE UNIFICATION OF PRIVATE LAW,
ROME 15 MARCH 1940¹ (THE AMENDMENT² WAS ADOPTED BY
RESOLUTION 37(1) AT THE THIRTY-SEVENTH SESSION OF
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON 9 NOVEMBER 1984)**

“Article 16

1.—The yearly expenditure relating to the operation and maintenance of the Institute shall be covered by the income specified in the budget of the Institute, and this shall include, in the first place the ordinary basic contribution of the Italian Government, the promoter of the Institute, as approved by the Italian Parliament, and which that Government declares to be fixed, as from 1985, at 300 million Italian lire per annum and which may be revised at the end of each period of three years by the law approving the budget of the Italian State as well as the ordinary yearly contributions of the other participating Governments.”
