Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and CAB International (previously known as the Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux) regarding the Headquarters of the Organisation, signed at London on 5 August 1982¹ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement").

- 2. I now have the honour to propose the following amendments to the Agreement:
- (1) In Article 1(a) delete "Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux" and replace with "CAB International".
- (2) In Articles 1(e) 16 and 17 delete "Executive Director" and replace with "Director General".
- (3) After Article 4(2) insert the following new paragraph:
- "(3) The Organisation shall be accorded a refund of Insurance Premium Tax and Air Passenger Duty paid by the Organisation in the exercise of its official activities."
- 3. If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to CAB International, I have the honour to propose that this Note, together with your reply in that sense, shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom² and Northern Ireland and CAB International which shall enter into force on the date on which the United Kingdom legislation giving effect to the amendments come into force.
