DECLARATION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND FRANCE, ABROGATING THE AGREEMENT OF NOVEMBER 8, 1899, RESPECTING THE EXCHANGE OF PRESS TELEGRAMS.*

Signed at Paris, January 11, 1910.

THE Government of His Britannic Majesty and the Government of the French Republic, in view of the changes made by the International Telegraph Conference in the provisions regarding press telegrams, and of the expediency of applying to press telegrams exchanged between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the one hand, and France (including Corsica), Algeria and Tunis, on the other hand, the provisions of the International Telegraph Regulations in force at the time of handing in, have agreed as follows :

The Agreement signed at Paris on the 8th day of November 1899, between Great Britain and France for the exchange, between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the one hand, and France (including Corsica), Algeria and Tunis, on the other hand, of telegrams in-
