Sir,

I HAVE the honour to propose that, in pursuance of the arrangements discussed by the representatives of our two Governments in Lisbon, the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Portuguese Government supplementary to the Monetary Agreement of the 16th April, 1946,⁽¹⁾ and signed in London on the 26th February, 1947,⁽²⁾ shall be regarded as having been abrogated with effect from the 12th December.

If the Portuguese Government agree to this proposal. I have the honour to suggest that the present note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.
