**TEXT OF NOTES FROM HER MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN
THE UNITED KINGDOM TO THE DANISH, ICELANDIC,
ITALIAN, LUXEMBOURG, NETHERLANDS, NORWEGIAN,
SWEDISH AND SWISS GOVERNMENTS, EXEMPTING THEIR
RESPECTIVE NATIONALS FROM THE NECESSITY OF
OBTAINING VISAS FOR TRAVEL TO SINGAPORE, THE
FEDERATION OF MALAYA AND NORTH BORNEO
(EXCLUDING BRUNEI)**

In his Note of the 10th of August, 1950,⁽¹⁾ the late Mr. Ernest Bevin had the honour to inform Count Reventlow that it had become necessary to re-impose the visa requirement for all foreign nationals travelling to Singapore and the Federation of Malaya and that as from the 24th of August, 1950 Danish subjects would require visas for the purpose of travel to these territories, and in a Note dated the 1st of October, 1951⁽²⁾ Mr. Herbert Morrison informed his Excellency that as from the 15th of October, 1951 it was necessary to re-impose the visa requirement for travel to North Borneo and Brunei.

I am now happy to inform you that as from the 1st of September, 1953 Danish subjects holding valid Danish passports will again be able to travel to Singapore, the Federation of Malaya and North Borneo (but not to Brunei) without the necessity of obtaining a visa in advance. It will of course be understood that Danish subjects travelling to these territories without visas will be required to comply with the Immigration Laws and Regulations in force in regard to entry, residence and the taking of employment.
