Her Majesty's Ambassador at Oslo to the Norwegian Minister for Foreign Affairs

British Embassy,

Your Excellency,

Oslo: July 12, 1955.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement constituted by the Notes exchanged at Oslo, on the 11th of October, 1937,(1) between the Government of Norway, and Hér Majesty's Governments in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland; in the Commonwealth of Australia and in New Zealand, and the Government of India; regarding the acceptance of licences or certificates of competency of the operating personnel of aircraft employed on regular airlines in lieu of national passports.

In the view of Her Majesty's Governments in the United Kingdom, in the Commonwealth of Australia and in New Zealand, the arrangements set out in the above-mentioned agreement have been superseded by paragraph 3.10 of the first edition of Annex 9 to the Convention on International Civil Aviation (paragraph 3.9 in the current second edition). The first edition of Annex 9 came into force on the 1st of March, 1950. If this view is also

shared by the Government of Norway, I have the honour to propose that the

said Agreement should be formally terminated in respect of Her Majesty's Governments as aforesaid and the Government of Norway.

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of Norway, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and your Excellency's reply in that sense should be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the Government of Norway and Her Majesty's Governments in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in the Commonwealth of Australia and in New Zealand terminating, with effect from to-day's date, the arrangements set out in the Exchange of Notes of the 11th of October, 1937.

Herr Ambassador, Oslo, July 12, 1955.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your Excellency's Note of to-day's date with its enquiry as to whether the Royal Norwegian Government are willing to terminate, as regards Norway on the one hand, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Commonwealth of Australia, and New Zealand on the other, the agreement on the acceptance of flight certificates instead of passports, &c., which was constituted by the Exchange of Notes of October 11, 1937.

With reference to this I have the honour to state that the Royal Norwegian Government are in agreement with the point of view which is put forward in your Excellency's Note and that they accept the proposal to consider your Excellency's Note and this reply as an agreement to terminate the above-mentioned arrangements, in respect of the parties named, with effect

from to-day.
