British Embassy,

Your Excellency,

The Hague, 25 January, 1967.

Acting upon instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland consider that the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands concerning the reciprocal validation of airworthiness certificates, constituted by the Exchange of Notes effected at The Hague on the 22nd of October, 1957,⁽¹⁾ and which entered into force on the 5th of August, 1958, lost its significance as from the 25th of October, 1962, being the date on which the Multilateral Agreement relating to Certificates of Airworthiness for Imported Aircraft, signed at Paris on the 22nd of April, 1960,⁽²⁾ took effect between the United Kingdom and the Netherlands.

I now have the honour to propose, therefore, on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom, that the said bilateral agreement shall be deemed to have terminated as from the 25th of October, 1962. If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, I suggest that the present Note and Your Excellency's reply in that sense should constitute an agreement to that effect between the two Governments which shall enter into force on the date on which the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands shall have informed the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland that the formalities constitutionally required in the Kingdom of the Netherlands have been complied with.⁽³⁾

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of Your Excellency's Note of the 25th of January, 1967, which reads as follows:

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, who therefore agree that the bilateral Agreement of the 22nd of October, 1957, concerning the reciprocal validation of airworthiness certificates shall be deemed to have terminated as from the 25th of October, 1962, and that Your Excellency's Note and the present reply shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments to that effect, and shall enter into force on the date on which the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands shall have informed the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland that the formalities constitutionally required in the Kingdom of the Netherlands have been complied with.
