Sir,

On instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs, I have the honour to inform you that the Governments of the Trucial States (namely Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ras-Al-Khaimah, Umm al Qaiwain, Ajman and Fujairah) have expressed a desire that arrangements might be made whereby they could participate in assistance from the United Nations Children's Fund and, in this connexion, I have the honour to propose that, in accordance with the desire of these Governments, the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund, which was signed at London on the 7th of October, 1953<sup>(1)</sup>, and the Protocol to that Agreement, which was signed at New York on the 7th of July, 1959<sup>(2)</sup>, shall, pending further consideration of possible revision of these instruments, be regarded as extended to the Trucial States, for the conduct of whose international relations the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland are responsible.

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the United Nations, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom, acting on behalf of the Governments of the Trucial States, and the United Nations.
