Dear Mr. Kazunga

I have the honour to refer to discussions that have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Zambia concerning the continuance of the British Expatriates Supplementation (Zambia) Agreement 1971⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:—

- (1) In sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures "31 March 1976" and substitute therefor "31 March 1981".
- (2) Delete paragraph 7 of the First Annex and substitute therefor:—

"In order to obviate over-payment by the Government of the United Kingdom the Employing Authority will immediately inform the Government of the United Kingdom of any event which might affect obligations of the Government of the United Kingdom under this Agreement to make payment to a designated officer; and if the Employing Authority fail to comply with this paragraph and that failure results in the Government of the United Kingdom making an over-payment to an officer, the Employing Authority will unless the failure arose in circumstances beyond the control of the Employing Authority reimburse the Government of the United Kingdom the whole of that over-payment. The Government of the United Kingdom will however return to the Employing Authority any moneys recovered from the officer in respect of such over-payment, less the costs of recovery".

- (3) Following paragraph 10 of the First Annex add a new paragraph 11 as follows:—

"11. The Employing Authority will provide each designated officer within six weeks of his arrival in Zambia with approved accommodation and basic furnishings of reasonable standards appropriate to the rank and family circumstances of the officer at a rent reasonable to his local basic salary".

(4) To the Second Annex after “(a) University of Zambia” add “(b) Post and Telecommunications Corporation”.

2. If this Note correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Zambia which shall enter into force on 31 March 1976 and which shall be cited, together with the Agreement, as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Zambia) Continuance) Agreement 1971/76.
