Count Hatzfeldt to the Earl of Kimberley.—(Received January 23.)

(Translation.)

My Lord,

German Embassy, January 19, 1895.

I HAVE the honour to inform your Excellency, by direction of my Government, that the accession of Servia to the Dresden Sanitary Convention, signified in a note of the 16th July last by the then Servian Chargé d'Affaires, in the name of his Government, no objections having been raised by any of the interested States, may be looked upon as complete. The Servian Government will be acquainted with this by the Imperial Government through their Legation at Berlin.
