In continuation of my note of the 12th May, 1906, the receipt of which you acknowledged on the 22nd of that month, I have the honour, by direction of the Swiss Federal Council, to inform your Excellency that, according to a note from the Legation of the United States of Brazil in Switzerland, dated the 26th January last, the Brazilian Government, duly authorized by the National

Congress at Rio de Janeiro, had definitively adhered to the Convention concluded at Geneva on the 22nd August, 1864, for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded in armies in the field.
