**AMENDMENT
TO SCHEDULE I OF THE SINGLE CONVENTION ON NARCOTIC
DRUGS, 1961⁽¹⁾**

The following amendment, which was notified on 19 October 1966 by the Secretary-General of the United Nations to all Governments Parties to the Convention, has been adopted by decision of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations following a recommendation of the World Health Organisation in accordance with Article 3 of the Convention.

Add to Schedule I

The substance M.183 (the proposed international non-proprietary name of which is acetorphine) and

The substance M.99 (the proposed international non-proprietary name of which is etorphine).

The Commission decided that the substance M.285 (the proposed international non-proprietary name of which is cyprenorphine) should not be placed on any of the Schedules of the Convention.

In accordance with paragraph 7 of Article 3 of the Convention such a decision of the Commission becomes effective with respect to each Party on the date of its receipt of a communication from the Secretary-General conveying the terms of the decision. The Parties thereupon take such action as may be required under the Convention.

The communication from the Secretary-General was received by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs on 24 October 1966 and the amendment therefore became effective with respect to the United Kingdom on that date.
